



Emmanuel Anglican College Chaplaincy Team Overview

As the College continues to grow and works to fulfilling the key objectives of the Constitution and our mission it is timely that we consider the model that we are developing for Chaplaincy. With the College Chaplain position vacant we have an opportunity to review our current practice and re-shape the model to suit the future needs of the College.

The model below is designed to be phased in progressively, commencing with the appointment of a College Chaplain. The time allocation proposed are recommended to be in place when the enrolment reaches 750 Pre-school –Year 12 (currently 640)

College Chaplain (Full Time)

- Ordained Anglican Minister licensed by the Bishop
- Provide spiritual and religious leadership to the College
- Member of the College Executive
- Promoting and enhancing the Mission and values of the College
- Facilitating opportunities for faith development and expression including leading the liturgical life of the College
- Oversee the development and implementing the Religious and Values Education program
- Liaise with the local parishes and the broader diocese to together explore ways of providing ministry
- Coordinating staff and student involvement in community service and social outreach
- Providing pastoral care to members of the College community including acting as a point of referral for students needing direction to specialist support
- Coordinating retreats and spiritual components of camps

Staff Chaplain (6 hours a week plus additional as required)

- Ordained or Lay Anglican Minister,
- Providing opportunities for prayer and reflection for staff
- Providing pastoral care and support for staff

Families Chaplain (0.4 FTE)

Ordained or Lay Anglican Minister

- Explore opportunities to build links and foster relationships between the College, families, parishes and the broader church
- Provide opportunities for prayer and reflection for parents, families and friends of the College
- Provide pastoral care and support for families
- Develop a sacramental program for students and family members

Youth Chaplain (0.4FTE or 12 hours a week)

Committed Christian person with appropriate skills and qualification. Could be a trainee. Develop opportunities for students to explore and express their faith

- Establish and coordinate student centred Christian groups and activities
- Provide opportunities for student prayer and reflection

Religious and Values Education Teachers

- Develop and deliver appropriate, meaningful and effective teaching and assessment programs
- Support and encourage students questioning on matter of faith, values and meaning
- Liaise with and support the chaplaincy team
